Marina (14) and Emma Jane (15) Pendleton began Suzuki violin lessons with Karen Naifeh Harmon 11 years ago. The girls were introduced to fiddling at ages 5 and 6, respectively, by the "First Lady of Country Fiddle", Jana Jae, and have enjoyed competing in fiddle contests and performing ever since. The girls were privileged to perform in concert with Lyle Lovett and at galas honoring Garth Brooks and Toby Keith. They also performed in Branson, on national TV, and are regulars on a local kids' TV series. Emma Jane is the reigning Kansas State Fiddle Champion, Patsy Montana National Yodeling Champion, and Grand Lake National Fiddle Fest Jr. Champion, Marina is the reigning Oklahoma Jr. Fiddle Champion and Kansas Jr. Fiddle Champion. Marina has also won prizes for her mandolin-

playing, which is mostly self-taught. Together, Emma Jane and Marina are the 2009 Colorado State Twin-Fiddle Champions.

Virginia Pendleton started learning to play her grandmother's violin in 5th grade in the elementary school orchestra, and had to guit after 6th grade because her junior high had no orchestra. The seed of

violin playing lay dormant until she introduced Emma Jane and Marina to the violin around 1996. Virginia also took up the mandolin a few years ago and joined

in the family band playing fiddle and mandolin.

Scott Pendleton kept a guitar under his bed gathering dust for 10 years until Jana Jae encouraged him to learn backup rhythm

guitar for his fiddle-playing daughters.

He plans to keep his day job.

David McNamee, Virginia's brother from Houston, got his first acoustic guitar at age 11, and later took up the electric bass, performing regularly with many rock, country, and blues bands. By popular demand, David took up the upright bass and drums and also performs and

Music Association's Oklahoma chapter. He frequently performs at such venues as The National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum in Oklahoma City and the Chevenne Cowboy Symposium in Wyoming.



Travis Gregg was born in Lawton. A pilot in World War II. he achieved the rank of major. After the war, he and his brother owned Red Star Oil Company, a
